First of all it was a pleasure to share our time with all members of your enthusiastic team involved in this European project. We congratulate you for the great work you have done together and the warm and trusting atmosphere you already have in your team, which is for us one of the main keys in cooperative working.

We offer you our feedback related to different observations we made during this time.

Organization and coordination

We highlight as positive the structure and well planned times.

The different teams made a very good job at explaining their working plans and how they are integrated in the same common goal. About the television team we suggest it could be changed to be called “audiovisual media”.

Having the planning facilitated the organization of the topics, although the plan changes or discussions points could have been explained at the beginning of every day to facilitate the global vision of the journey.

In order to assess, we propose some kind of oral feedback at the end of each day related to different elements such as communication, cooperation, the art of making questions, interaction etc... . This could be recorded and later be used as an instrument of analysis and reflection about how we manage feedback in our jobs.

Communication

Use of the English language by most of teachers involved was wonderful.

It was excellent that students cooperated actively in the development of the sessions offering a very good service during the coffee break and recording our meetings.

The responsible people at school for management offered very good conditions and facilities of the working room.

Project development

One of the elements we assess as positive is we could see the concrete goals of every step, even with dates, and the way you made decisions on what resources you are using to communicate.

During the sessions we found great the critical thinking and discussions generated. We think most of the questions made in the sessions helped us to make the process clearer and more visible with the strong and weak elements of each school involved.

We wonder how to improve in the area of setting common criteria about frames for the products (interview, surveys, checklist, videos) and to make decisions on which videos for example could be uploaded and who would take the final decisions in order to select the ones that suit better to your goals.

We consider the creation of a common file where you share every action made in the different countries can be very helpful for continuous assessment and to make more visible the progress.

You work in different countries and schools with their own characteristics, so flexibility plays a very important role as it was mentioned during the sessions.

We hope our feedback can contribute to further improvement and we would be glad to meet you at the next meeting.
